

Jerome Feldman's Biography

Jerome Feldman is a Prof. Emeritus of EECS and of Cognitive Science at UC Berkeley.

He received a BS in 1960 in physics from Rochester and a PhD from Carnegie-Mellon in 1964. After 2 years at MIT Lincoln Lab, he joined the Stanford Computer Science Department and AI lab from 1966-74. He then became the founding chair of the CS Department at Rochester 1974-87, where he was also a Vice-Provost and held the Desauer Chair. In 1987, Feldman came to Berkeley as Prof. of EECS and Director of ICSI, the International Computer Science Institute, where he remains head of AI. He has been active in institutional and international activities and has advised over a hundred graduate and post-doctoral students. His work covers multiple areas in CS and Cognitive Science. He is currently best known for his pioneering efforts in AI and Neural Networks.
