- 1. Ara Pacis

15. Aventine Hill Keyhole (Il Buco della Serratura)

- Hidden on the Aventine Hill, the "Il Buco della Serratura" is a unique spot. Look through a keyhole in the doorway of the Priory of the Knights of Malta and discover a picturesque view of St. Peter's Basilica framed by perfectly manicured gardens. It's a hidden gem offering a one-of-a-kind peek into the city.
- Note: It's best to visit during daylight hours to fully appreciate the view

16. Bocca della Verità (The Mouth of Truth)

- Located in the portico of the Church of Santa Maria in Cosmedin, the Bocca della Verità is an ancient stone mask with a legendary past. According to tradition, it would bite off the hand of anyone telling a lie. Test your honesty by placing your hand inside and watch for your reaction!
- Note: There may be a small admission fee to enter the church.
